Paper Submission Guidelines

Submitted papers must not have previously been presented or published elsewhere. Selected papers that are submitted may be published in a special issue of a refereed journal or in book form.

Text

Submitted papers must be in English, 6000 words in maximum, and in Word format, left justified. Use 12 point Times New Roman typescript throughout, with one inch margins all around. Manuscripts should be double spaced and should include, in the following order: cover sheet, title (two lines maximum), abstract (maximum 250 words), key words (up to 10 words or phrase), introduction, text, acknowledgements, reference and notes.

Include a cover sheet which has the title; authors' name(s), affiliation(s) (including full addresses and email addresses). Also on a separate sheet include biographical notes (approximately 100 words per author).

Use section and sub-section bold numbering and titles, justified left in all cases (e.g., **3. Logistics Management Model 3.1. Model Dimensions**, etc)

References and Notes

- Present the references in alphabetical order by the last name of the first author
- In the text, a reference is indicated by the last name of the first order (Smith, 2006) or in case of multiple authors (Crawford et al., 2005; Kim, 2003).
- References should be made only to works that are published or available through libraries or institutions. Any other source should be qualified by a note regarding availability.
- Full references should include all author names and initials, year of publication, title of paper, title of publication, volume and issue number, publisher, page numbers.

Tables and Figures

- All illustrations, whether diagrams or photographs, should be referred to as Figures and numbered sequentially. Please place them in the text, following as closely as feasible after their first mention.
- Tables should also be numbered sequentially and placed in the text as soon as feasible after their first mention.
- Figure and Table numbers and captions should be in bold text, directly below the figure or tables to which they refer.
